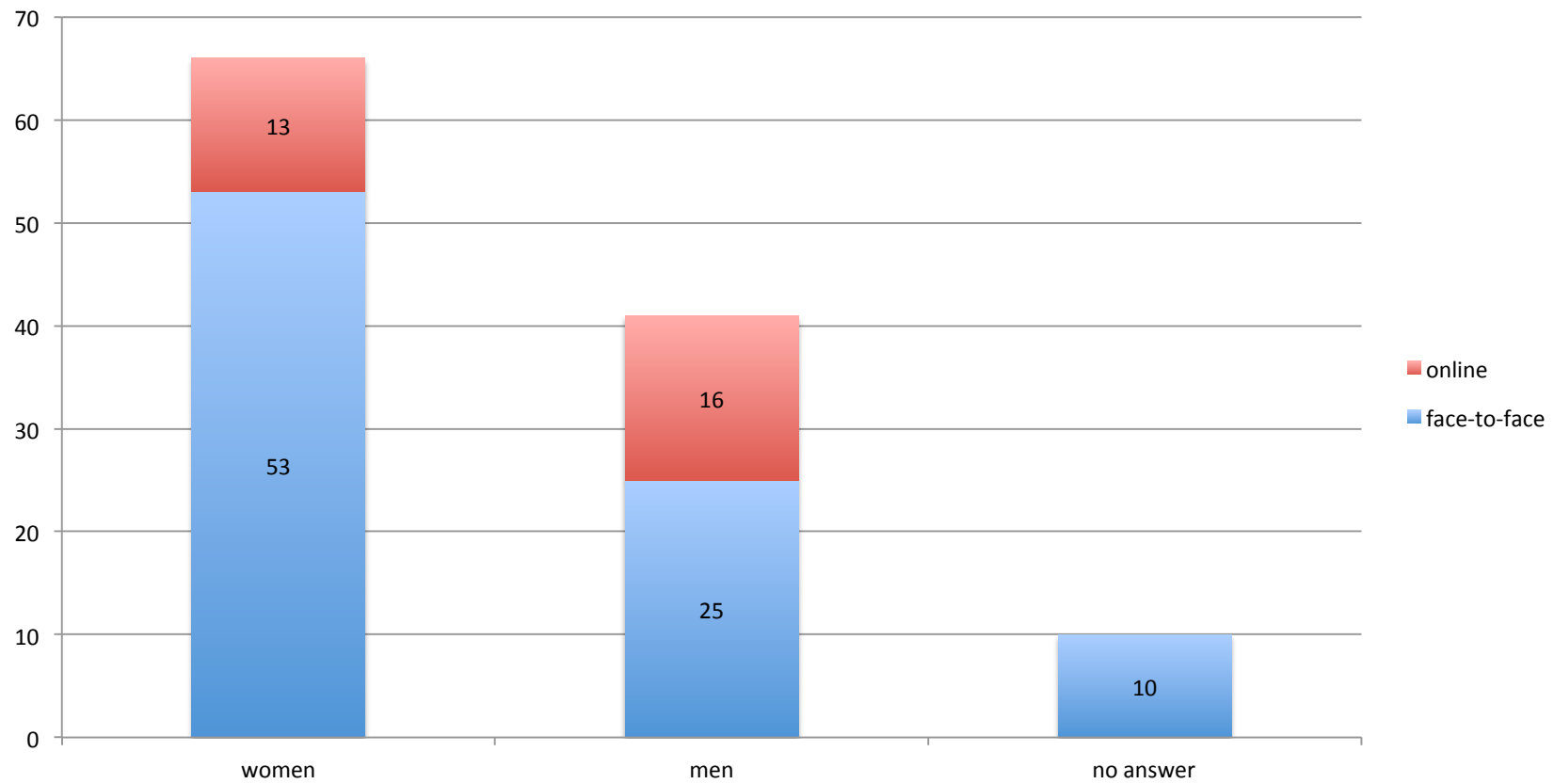


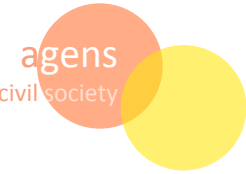

Respondents' age

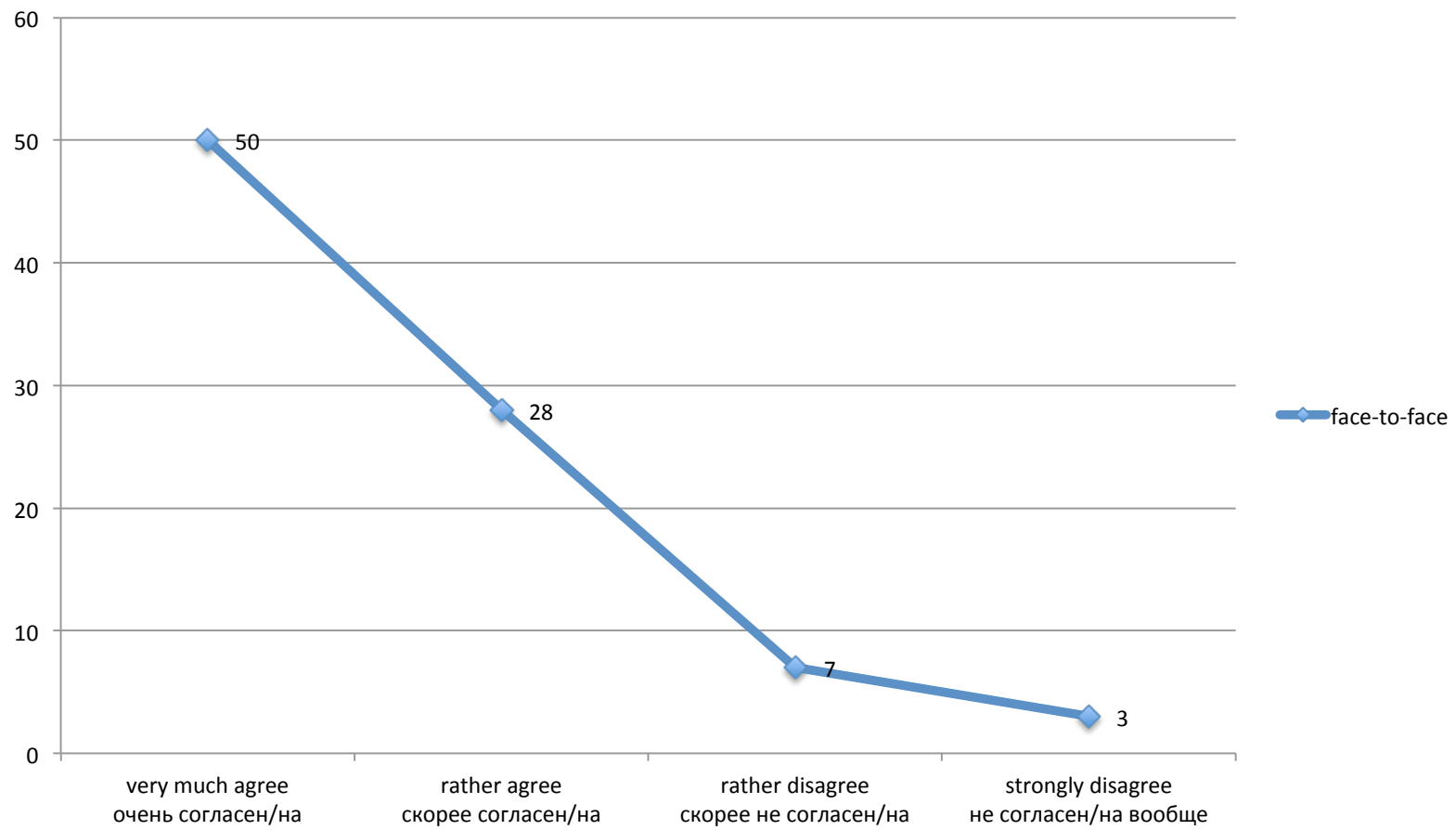


General observations

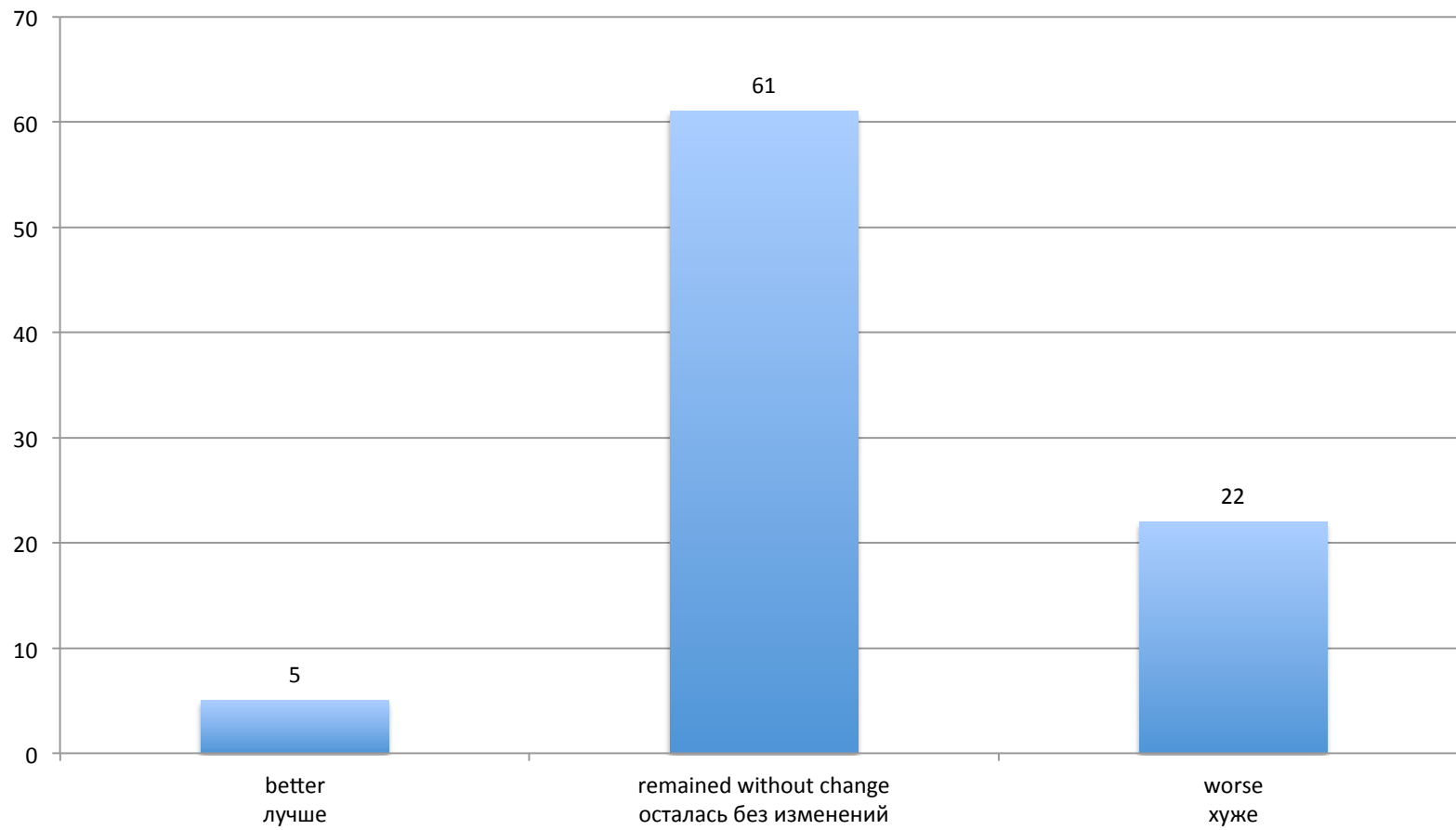


«I practically do not communicate with friends who stayed in Pervomaisk. They have washed brains.»

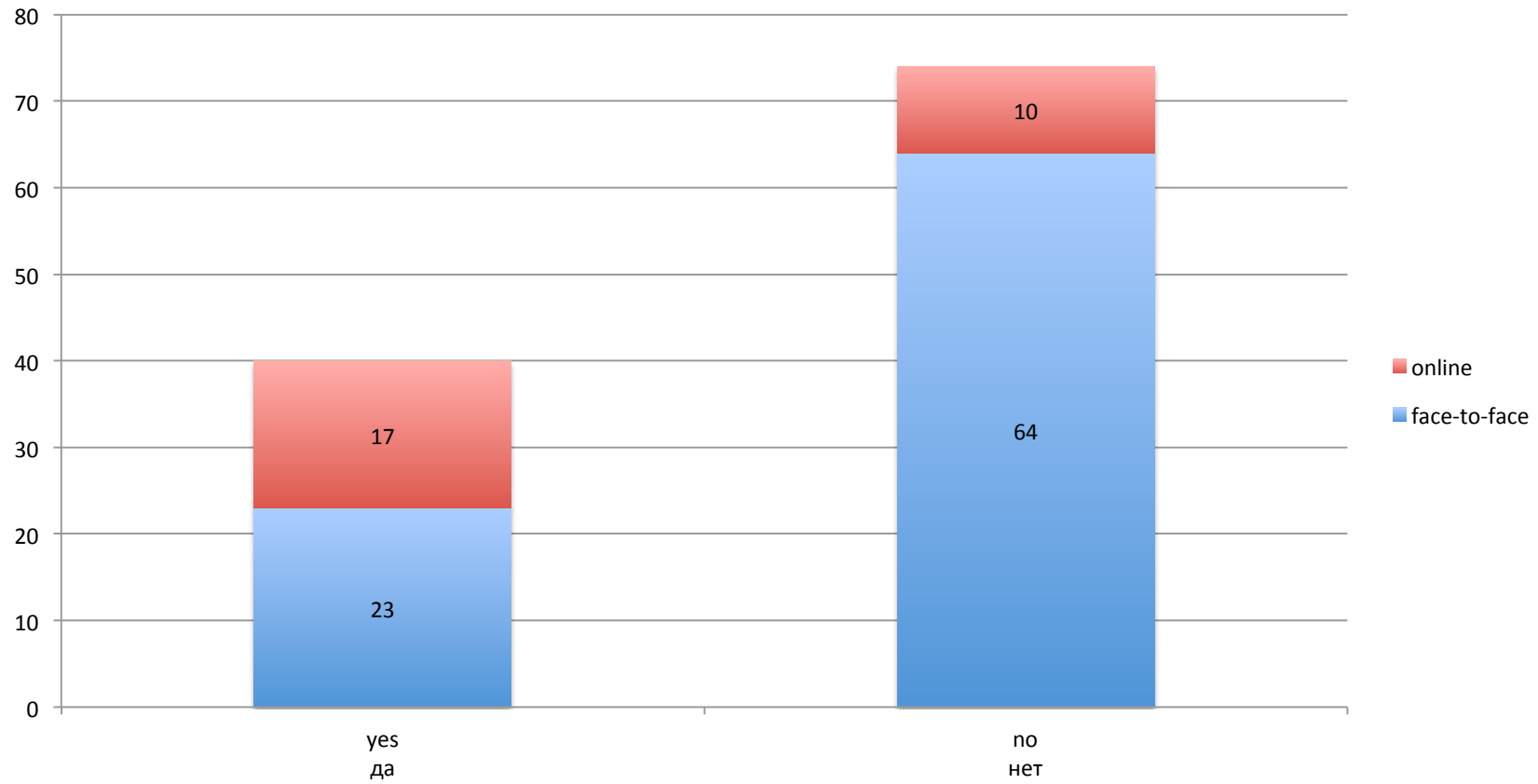

„Almost before my eyes, a woman in the courtyard of the mine Privolnyanskaya perished from the explosion of the projectile.“

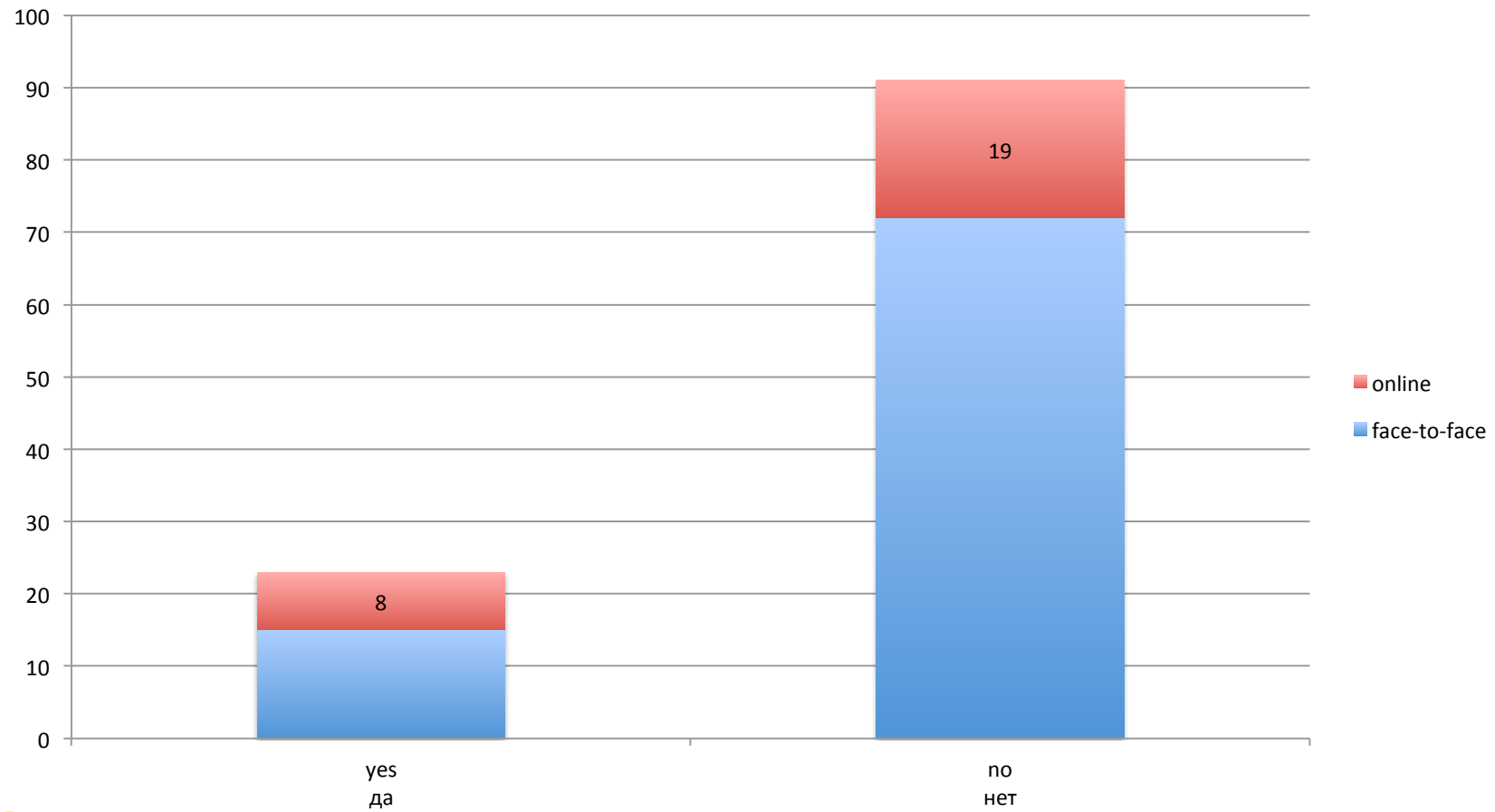

I lost family or friends during the war

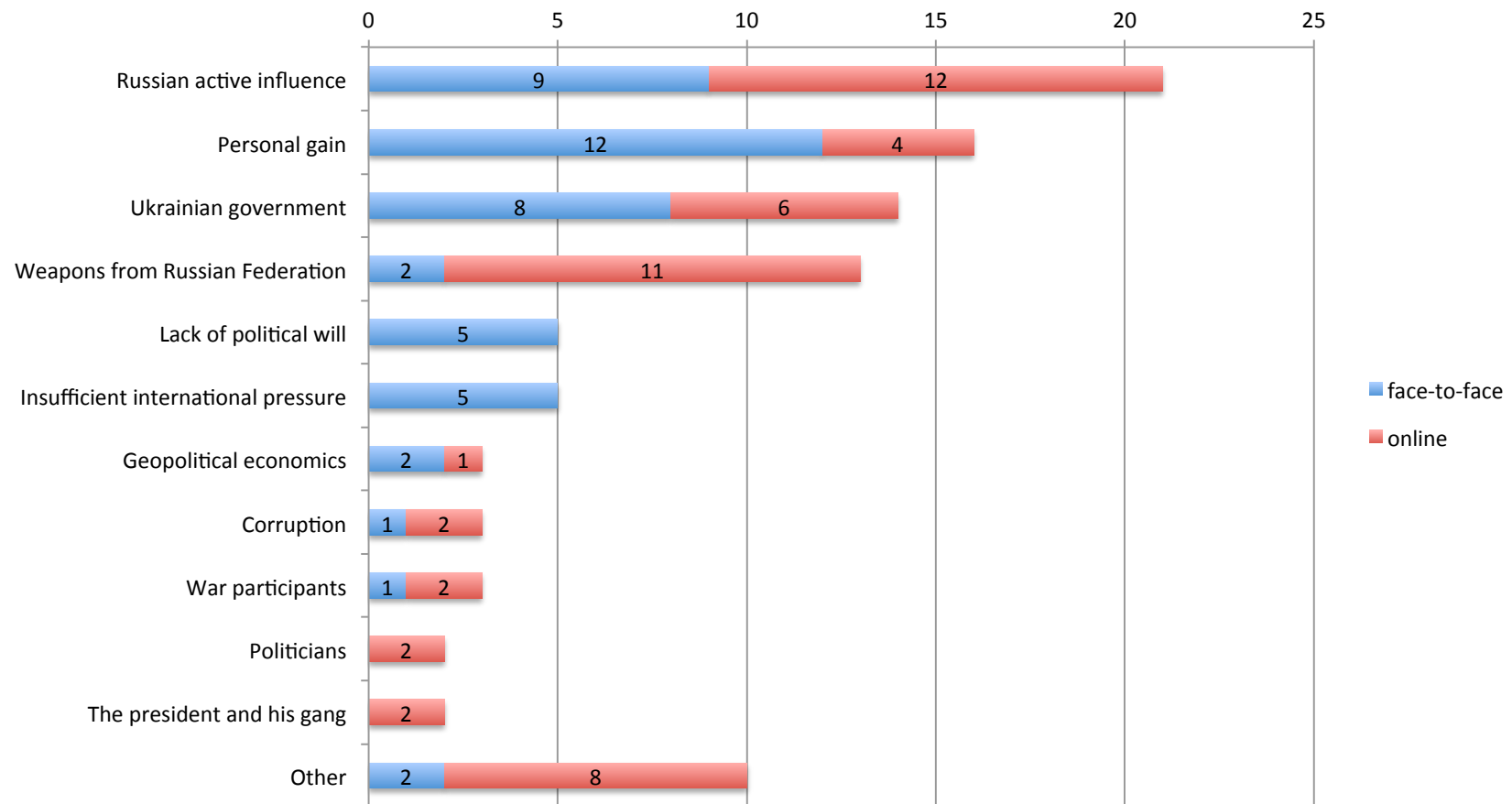


„I called my brother to come to Ukraine. He developed a mental disability and disappeared, somewhere near the border.“

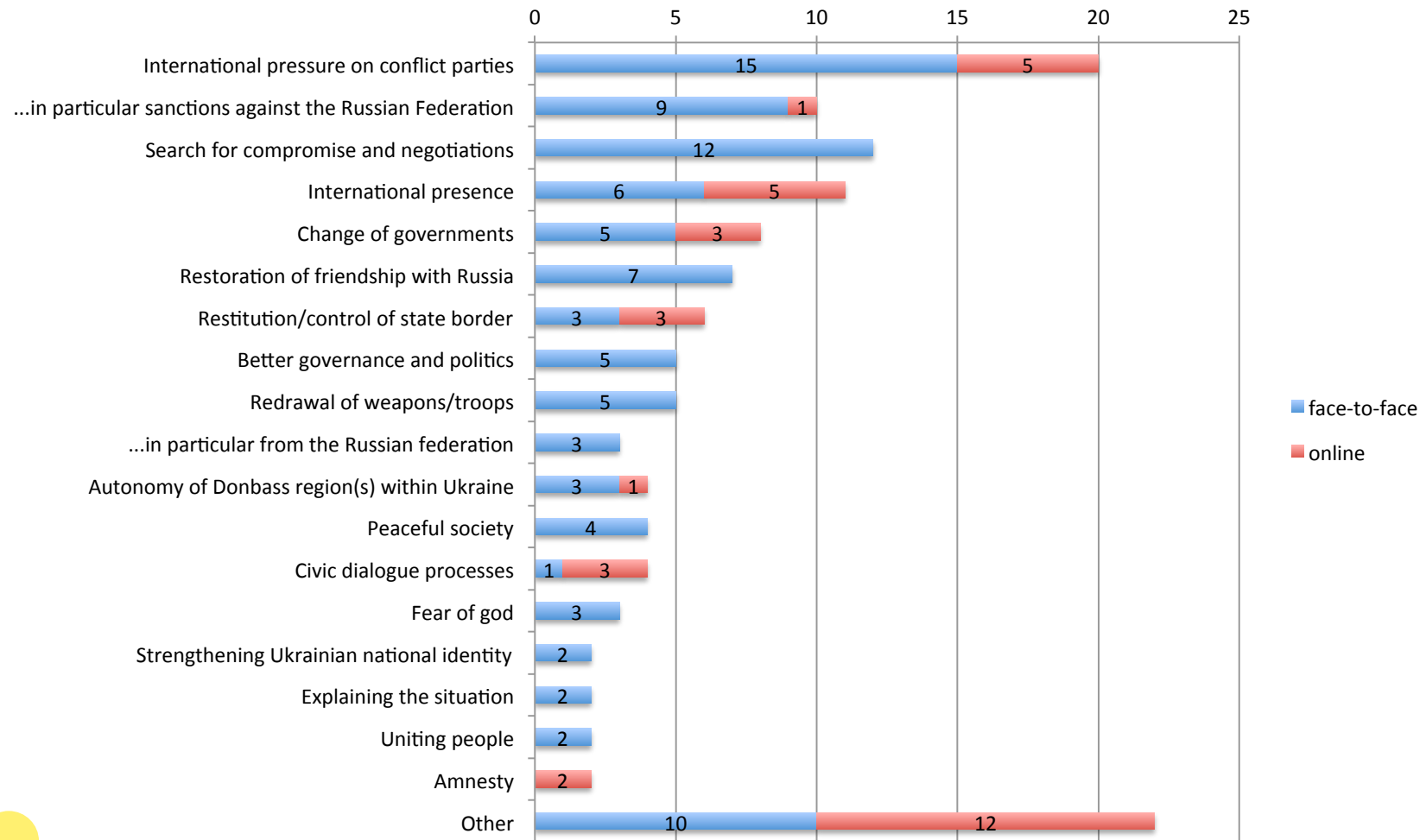
